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Project: Twisted Triangles

Careful arrangement of brightly colored half-square triangles produces vibrant diamonds in a quickly pieced baby quilt. Choose whimsical prints like these, from the Butterfly Fling collection designed by Me & My Sister for Moda Fabrics.

General Tip

Use a design wall or other flat surface to lay out the triangles in a diagonal pattern for the quilt top. Assemble triangle squares one at a time and replace on design wall.

Materials

- ½ yard each green, turquoise, yellow, and pink tone-on-tones (squares)
- ¼ yard purple tone-on-tone (squares)
- ½ yard each assorted turquoise, pink, purple, green, and yellow prints (squares)
- ¾ yard purple stripe (binding)
- 2**¾** yards backing fabric
- 48×60" batting

Finished Quilt: 421/2×541/2"

Quantities are for 44/45"-wide, 100% cotton fabrics.

Measurements include ⅓" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order. From green tone-on-tone, cut:

■ 8—6%" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 16 triangles total

From turquoise tone-on-tone, cut:

■ 8—6%" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 16 triangles total; you will use 15

From yellow tone-on-tone, cut:

 8-6%" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 16 triangles total

From pink tone-on-tone, cut:

 6-6¾" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 12 triangles total

From purple tone-on-tone, cut

■ 2—6%" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 4 triangles total

From assorted turquoise prints, cut:

■ 7—6%" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 14 triangles

From assorted pink prints, cut:

■ 6-6%" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 12 triangles (you will use 11)

From assorted purple prints, cut:

■ 8—6%" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 16 triangles (you will use 15)

From assorted green prints, cut:

■ 6—6%" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 12 triangles (you will use 11)

From assorted yellow prints, cut:

 6-6¾" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 12 triangles

From purple stripe, cut:

 1-27" square, cutting it diagonally into enough 2½"-wide strips to total 210" in length for bias binding

Assemble Triangle-Squares

- Sew together one assorted tone-on-tone triangle and one assorted print triangle to make a triangle square (Triangle-Square). Press seam toward print fabric. The triangle square should be 6½" square including seam allowances.
- 2. Following Quilt Assembly
 Diagram repeat Step 1 to make
 63 triangle-squares total.


Assemble Quilt Center

- Referring to Quilt Assembly
 Diagram, lay out trianglesquares in nine horizontal rows.
- 2. Sew together pieces in each row. Press seams in one direction, alternating direction with each row. Join rows to make quilt top. Press seams in one direction.


Finish Ouilt

- **1.** Layer quilt top, batting, and backing; baste.
- 2. Quilt as desired.
- **3.** Bind with purple stripe bias binding strips.
