

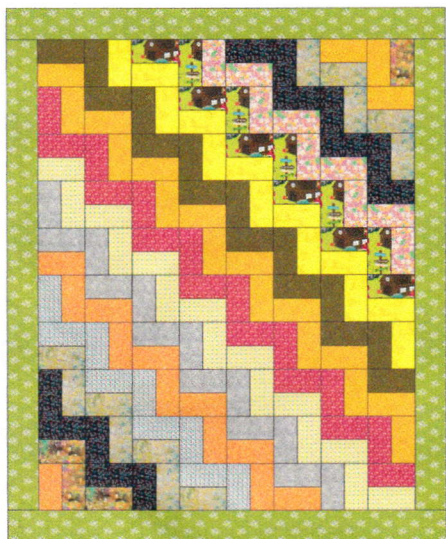
Delozier's Delight Charity Quilt Instructions

This pattern was created by the Baltimore Heritage Quilters Guild's own Jeanne Delozier in response to our members' questions about what to make for a charity quilt! You can make this quilt a variety of ways, with or without borders. Two options are shown below, and the instructions are based on a 48'x 60' (without border) or 56' x 68' (with a 4" border).



Materials Needed

- **Blocks:** 160 $3\frac{1}{2}$ x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strips = $2\frac{3}{4}$ yards
 - 80 lights/mediums (A)
 - 80 darks (B)
- **Border:** $4\frac{1}{2}$ " wide; 2 strips that are 48" long for the top and 2 strips that are 60" for the sides = $1\frac{1}{4}$ yards
- **Binding:** $2\frac{1}{2}$ " = $\frac{3}{4}$ yard
- **Backing:** $3\frac{3}{4}$ yards



Making Your Blocks

- Sew 1 strip of Fabric A to 1 strip of Fabric B
- Make 80 $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square blocks

Assembling Your Quilt Top

- Arrange your blocks randomly for a scrappy pattern (top left)
- Arrange your blocks to make a specific pattern (bottom left)
- Make 8 rows of 10 blocks
- Sew rows together
- Add border

Quilting: An all-over pattern works well and is the simplest. Another approach is to put a specific pattern in the border and use an all-over pattern for the rest of the quilt.
